





During semester two, Prep, Year one and two students learned Japanese. I could not stop smiling and admiring each class in the first week of this term because many students (including prep students) participated enthusiastically and were nice to each other. Regardless of the last year's very disrupted learning and the half year break (when I was teaching older students), many Year one and two students remembered the key Japanese words and phrases! My key focus (during normal onsite schooling) are students' social and emotional skills development with Japanese language and cultural elements. If we are lucky enough to have normal schooling during this term, prep students will learn Japanese through traditional Japanese folk stories, Year one and two will learn geography elements partially using Japanese.

Finally regarding the Japanese Speaking Contest, at this moment, Frankston Susono Friendship Association plans to host the annual Japanese Speaking Contest early September this year. Normally many schools around Frankston and the Peninsula region participate in this contest. I have started having short speaking practice sessions with those who like to try. Once we are back to the normal schooling, I am planning to offer extra speaking practice sessions during Monday play time for those who are still interested.

School Uniform Policy.

Students wear school uniform to create a strong sense of belonging to the Overport Primary School student community. Within the policy there is a mention of our uniform, the wearing of jewellery, the requirement around hair and hats. The policy was developed after consultation with the school community at School Council sub-committee of Education, now 'Parent Voices', and the Student Representative Council. It was reviewed in February 2019. The Dress Code was designed with the view to providing choice for the students through different clothing options allowing for students to safely engage in the many varied school activities, minimising competition and caters for the financial constraints of families. It is timely that we review this again and we plan to engage our student leaders and student voice leaders to have input into the policy as well as at a Parent Voice forum. We welcome your input.
