Here are some activities for you to complete at home if you wish. As you complete each activity colour it in on the grid.

Read a book. Read books from home or use PM online or Epic- your passwords are in your yellow reading diary.	Practise writing a sentence/ sentences. Remember to include a capital, spaces and a full stop.	Listen to the story 'Hey little ant' on Youtube. Make a list of all the words you can think of that contain the sound 'a' (a as in apple, not a as in ape). Highlight the sound.	Write numbers to 100. Try making sure you start in the right spot and face them the right way.	Talk about our community and who are the people who help us, e.g. doctors, postman, firefighter etc. Act out their jobs.	Do a 10 minute mindfulness activity, e.g. Cosmic Kids yoga or kids meditation on YouTube, colouring cloud watching, etc.
Draw the start, middle and end of a story.	Draw a picture and label the parts.	Choose some words from the list, write them and then draw a line to segment them into sounds, e.g. a/ p p/ le	Uses blocks to make tens and ones, e.g. one stick of 10 Lego and 4 lose ones makes 14.	Draw and make a list of things the people in our community do to help us.	Write and draw 3 things you are grateful for.
Look at a book and predict what might happen. Draw a picture.	Make some signs to use in play, e.g. road signs, restaurant signs, house labels.	Make a poster about the 'a' sound using words, drawings and magazine pictures and words.	Choose a number and find the number that comes before or after it.	Make a poster with photographs or drawings of special events you celebrate as a family.	Play a game with someone in your family
Listen to a story and visualize and draw the pictures.	Practise writing on the lines using your practise book sent home last week.	Listen to The Sound Waves Chant' on YouTube. Think of words that rhyme with bat, man and had.	Practise making patterns. Try and make them trickier and trickier! You can use shapes, toys, pictures, numbers, etc.	Create a family tree.	Choose 2 chores to do around the house.
Read a book and think of questions as you read. You might like to write these down.	Cut a picture out of a magazine and either write a story about it or make labels.	Find an 'a' word that means: A person A body part A group of people Rhymes with sand, sack Starts with /h/ Starts with /s/ Ends with /t/	Skip count by 2, 5 and 10.
