Lock Down Continues.

Dear Parents and Carers

The Victorian Government has announced arrangements for schools in Victoria from and including Friday 4 June.

Based on advice from the Victorian Chief Health Officer, all schools in metropolitan Melbourne will continue with remote and flexible learning until Thursday 10 June. This includes our school.

Existing arrangements for on-site supervision of vulnerable children and the children of authorised workers continue to be in place. As I advised you earlier today.

There is one important change to the current settings.

Remote and flexible learning

Teachers will be forwarding new Home Learning Grids, Google meet times and related digital access codes by Friday afternoon for students to access for next week's remote learning. We are providing both on-line and off-line learning for all students.

On-site supervision

Our school will provide on-site supervision for students in the following categories:

- Children whose parents and/or carers are authorised workers who cannot work from home and where no other supervision arrangements can be made, including children of teachers in government schools who are required to return to work on-site.
- children experiencing vulnerability, including:
 - children in out-of-home care
 - children deemed vulnerable by a government agency, funded family or family violence service, and assessed as requiring education and care outside the family home
 - children identified by a school or early childhood service as vulnerable, (including via referral from a government agency, or funded family or family violence service, homeless or youth justice service or mental health or other health service)
