

#### Prep Enrolments 2023 being taken now!

If you have neighbours who have students ready for school next year, please direct them to the website for enrolment and tour information. Enrolment is preferable by Monday 18th July to assist us with class placement. Therefore, please enrol as soon as possible. A transition opportunity will be provided in term 4. In 2023, the new prep students will begin the first week and a half of 2023 in transition groups to ensure we get the best balance across the classes for optimum learning for all students. We look forward to welcoming our new preps for 2023.

#### Students - Household Close Contacts.

Where a student is a household contact of a positive case (that is, they have spent more than four hours with someone who has COVID-19 inside a house, accommodation or care facility), they must inform their child's teacher via email. Household and householdlike contacts are no longer required to quarantine as long as they take additional safety measures in the 7 days that would have been their quarantine period. If household contacts do not undertake the safety measures then they are required to isolate and test on Day 1 and Day 6 of isolation. Household contacts are required to inform the school that they are attending during the 7 day period. The safety measures include that a student 8 years and over is required to wear a mask unless they have a medical exemption, and to be tested on the first day and then 5 days within the 7 day isolation period of the infected person. Parents/carers are able to leave isolation if no other arrangements can be made to transport their non-infectious child via private vehicle to and/or from school. The person leaving self-isolation must travel directly to and from the location, cannot walk the child to class or make any stops, unless there is an emergency or as required by law. They must remain in the vehicle at all times, unless it is reasonably necessary to leave the vehicle to deliver the person to and from school, and must wear a face covering whilst outside the place of self-isolation.

In teaching for social and emotional learning and respectful relationships, we arm our students with strategies and resources to equip them for the future. Last Monday our staff undertook professional development in RRRR. This is underpinned by our curriculum for the 'Teaching for Social and Emotional Learning and Respectful Relationships.' This was extremely interesting and provided a great deal of quality understanding for our teachers to deliver this program in a sensitive and age-appropriate manner. The focus of this new curriculum initiative is to promote equality and respect for all people and begin to develop understanding that will support the minimisation of aggression that can lead to violence. The speaker outlined that since the pandemic, there has been a significant increase in family violence and related trauma. Hence our continued focus on respect for all.
