Naplan Results: On Tuesday after school our year 3 and 5 teachers shared the Naplan results with staff. We were delighted with the results. The requirements for the national minimum standards (NMS) show our students to be working at an excellent level in both years 3 and 5. The percentage of students that are

performing ABOVE the national minimum standard in each area are as follows: Year 3's – mathematics -79%, reading – 75%, writing – 92%, grammar – 85% and in spelling – 90%. For our Year 5's – mathematics - 82%, reading - 86%, writing - 86%, grammar -85% and in spelling – 90%. These results are very encouraging. So what are we doing really well? The percentage of students achieving above the minimum standard in all areas is over 80% in Year 5 and over 75% in Year 3. In Year 3, the best results were in Writing and Spelling. In Year 5, the best results were in Writing and Reading. It is evident that staff work well with students at their point of need, given the small number of students that are achieving below the minimum standard. (less than 4%). We teach the whole child and look at the big picture of education. We manage the arrival of new students well. We use the whole curriculum to inform our planning and, therefore, our data has integrity. What can we

improve on? A stronger focus on problem solving so that our students fully understand how to read,

interpret and comprehend the types of questions asked in NAPLAN. Continue to teach essential skills and provide real life application of those skills in all areas of the curriculum areas. Provide sufficient time for students to consolidate learning so skills and knowledge are embedded in their long term memory. We need to get the balance right between new

learning and embedding current learning. However, it is very satisfying for both the staff and parents to see we are well on the right track with our teaching and learning for our students.

Year Five Urban Camp: Last week our year five students attended their annual Urban camp in the city. They had an amazing time. They were praised by the camp staff for their wonderful behaviour and their teachers told me they were a joy to take. Thank you to the teachers and parents that attended, making this such a memorable experience for the students.

RACV Fund Raiser: Thank you to everyone that supported the RACV day last Friday. We are delighted to report that they raised \$1265.55 which is a wonderful effort and will be greatly appreciated by the push cart teams.

Swimming Program reminder: Don't forget that tomorrow is our second swimming day for years prep to 4. Remember to bring your bathers and towel!

Assistant Principal's Report

In preparation for 2017, it is important that all families who are eligible to receive CSEF funding, have submitted the relevant application. If you hold a valid concession card, your child is entitled to be funded \$125.00, which comes to the school and is used to offset the costs of camps, sporting activities and excursions. As well as support for these activities, all Prep and Year 7 CSEF recipients are also automatically eligible for uniform support through State School Relief. A basic uniform package can be organised through the school, (or your child's secondary school) simply by contacting us, and this can be easily arranged through SSR. Please be aware that this uniform support is only for Prep and Year 7 students. If you are currently receiving the CSEF payment, this will continue next year. You are not required to reapply.

Our annual Twilight Fair will be happening in two weeks' time. While we have many independent stall holders coming along to sell their goods, we also have a few school-based stalls, which we still need helpers for. Thanks to the many people who have already volunteered to assist.


