CUST—Cultural Understanding & Safety Training.

Our staff will begin undertaking Cultural Understanding and Sensitivity Training tonight. The training is mandated for all public servant services which includes school staff. It is aimed at developing greater awareness and understanding of appropriate and inappropriate behaviour towards others' culture. Because cultural differences can cause unintended offence and misunderstandings, it is important for teachers to be aware of these differences so they can better interpret students' behaviour or learning difficulties that may be based on cultural differences. This will allow them to develop ways to best support these students. Our program specifically addresses our Indigenous students and developing greater understanding and sensitivity around their culture. Our Indigenous garden provides a demonstration of respect for our cultural history for all students but particularly our Indigenous students. Staff will engage in two session.
